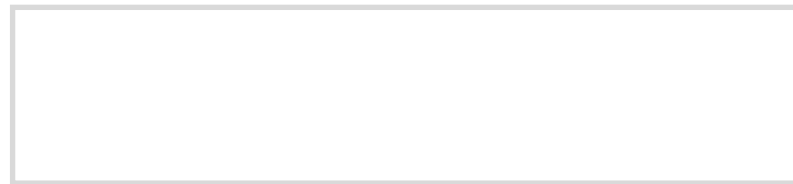

### Let Us Remember. Let Us Not Forget.

Some years ago I read about nursing homes employing a specialized staff member called an MLA. That is medical shorthand for "Memory Loss Assistant."

A MLA talks to the patients, reads them books, and leads them through patterning exercises that help their bodies recover skills such as walking.

An MLA tells patients their names, shows them pictures of family members and reminds them of their loved one's names.

One MLA said, "We do whatever we can to give our patients of measure of confidence and hope. And we help them remember and not forget."

Our Jewish friends will soon gather for Passover and remember their history of moving from slavery to freedom. The story is shared in a way so every person present senses they are going out of Egypt from slavery into freedom. **Let us remember. Let us not forget.**

As the week progresses, and the shadows lengthen, we will remember Jesus' washing the disciple's feet during their last meal together. ## Children's Ministry Update

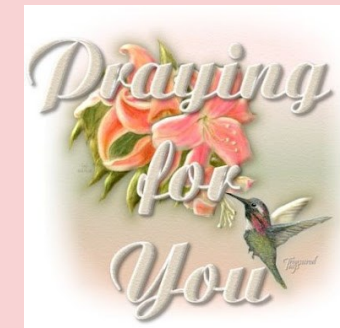
