A PRAYER TO REMEMBER

Some say it was written by Christian philosopher and martyr Boethius 1500 years ago. Some link it with 19th century theologian Friedrich Oetinger.


Most often minister/theologian Reinhold Niebuhr is credited with authorship. He said he had written the prayer as a tag line to a sermon he had delivered on practical Christianity. But he then suggested this prayer may have been "spooking around" for centuries but I honestly believe I wrote it myself."

Early in the days of World War II, with his permission, this prayer was printed on cards and distributed to the troops by the U. S. O. It has been reprinted by countless religious organizations. The prayer was widely popularized by the A. A. movement, who had it printed on small cards for members to carry in their wallets.

Fourteen years ago last week, this prayer pierced hearts as God's spirit poured through, as it was read during my nephew's memorial service. His young life tragically ended in an auto accident very early one Sunday morning that also left a young lady injured. The words reminded us that God can bring inner peace regardless of our life circumstances.

For two years this prayer was part of my late nephew's daily ritual. This is one of those great prayers I commend to everyone to read and carry its meaning to heart.

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; courage to change the things I can; and the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time; enjoying one moment at a time; accepting hardship as the pathway to peace; taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, not as I should have it; trusting that He will make things right if I surrender to His will; that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with Him forever in the next. Amen.
