

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

"The Main Thing is to Keep the Main Thing the Main Thing"

One of the "Seven Habits of Highly Effective People," according to Stephen Covey, is keeping our primary purpose and mission at the heart of all that we do. At TRUMC, we are a community of faith with a singular call to "Make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World." We seek to be a faithful band of believers, claimed by grace, who are learning to live like Jesus lived so that our lives will change the world.

If we are keeping the main thing the main thing, we find sacrificial love at the heart of all that we do. We follow Jesus as he goes to the well and offers living water to someone of an ethnicity that was despised by his community of faith. We follow Jesus who would not allow rules and religious assumptions to prevent him from caring for needs of others on the Sabbath. His love drove him to be surrounded by those that the [Hebrew] Bible-believing folks said were so lost that he should avoid them. Jesus called out the religious people whose showy piety was used to place themselves above others.

Jesus did not focus on the things that divide us. He came to help us see others the way that God does: all of us loved by God and every single person, without exception, deserving of love from others. Learning to follow Jesus like this will challenge us when we recognize that we do not always love the way that God loves us. Too many times we shake our heads, and we judge the person brought before us caught in their sin, telling them to "Go, and sin no more." But we are not sinless nor are we the Judge of the Nations. Instead, we should recognize the stones in our hands we are ready to throw. [John 8]

There will be many voices from the world that call us to distraction. They will cry that this issue or that issue, this stance or that stance must be assumed and affirmed. They will call for division and for separation. We will not be fooled; we must not be deterred. Our call is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. Let's take up our crosses and follow where Jesus leads. Let's risk everything for the sake of reckless love and watch God use us to change the world.

A Word from Your Lay Leaders








March Wednesday Meals
















HABITAT FOR HUMANITY - FAITH BUILD RECIPIENT
