ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S ARTICLE Reverend Mollie Reddic



If you've ever floundered and felt you aren't aligned with where God wants you to be in life, you know how unsettling it feels to not be using your spiritual gifts. It's like forcing a square peg in a round hole. You may already be making an effort to serve, saying yes when you are asked to fulfill a need within or outside the church community. But if you are not finding joy in serving in that role, it may be because your spiritual gift does not match that particular need. Instead, your gift is needed in a different type of ministry and saying no to the other opportunity gives you the space to say yes to a different ministry opportunity that is more aligned with who God created you to be.

One of my favorite quotes about the discerning of our Christian vocation is by theologian Howard Thurman. Thurman writes: "Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive."

I believe we "come alive" when we are using our spiritual gifts in the ways that God desires. I know I come alive when I am serving the poor, advocating for justice, and meeting new people. That's because God has blessed me with the gifts of mercy and hospitality and the Spirit energizes me in ways that are beyond my human capacity. I feel a deep connection to God and God's people when I am serving where I am called.

As I mentioned in my sermon on July 16th, I started a mom group in my last church. The success of the ministry was dependent upon members of that church serving in the nursery so that the moms could have uninterrupted time to discuss their faith. I prayed that God would lead those with the right gifts to serve with the children. God answered when two recently widowed women jumped at the chance to come two Mondays a month. How did I know that they were using their spiritual gifts? Every Monday they would leave saying, "We think we had more fun than the kids did!" The joy was evident! The Spirit equipped them to serve in a place where their greatest joy met the world's deep hunger. The women did not serve out of obligation. They served because the Spirit was prompting them to respond to an opportunity to bless others and an opportunity to grow in their own faith.

All Christians are called through their baptism to a ministry of servanthood in the world to the glory of God. We learn in the bible that as followers of Christ we are all given spiritual gifts. God gives each of us a desire to help in healing a broken world. Beginning August 20th, Pastor James and I will design Sunday worship experiences to explore what it means to be "All In" for God with our whole beings. While we help one another discern our spiritual gifts, we will witness God's Spirit enliven the church and bring transformation to God's world.

Antisemitism is a real and current issue. As United Methodists we abhor this prejudice and the often violent harassment our Jewish friends and neighbors experience. The UMC Social Principles (¶ 162 Rights of Religious Minorities) reminds us that "religious persecution has been common in the history of civilization. We urge policies and practices that ensure the right of every religious group to exercise its faith free from legal, political, or economic restrictions. We condemn all overt and covert forms of religious intolerance, being especially sensitive to their expression in media stereotyping. We assert the right of all religions and their adherents to freedom from legal, economic, and social discrimination."

The Church & Society core team invites everyone to continue to make this a summer of learning and discussion. Visit Richland Library Main (1431 Assembly St.) to view the exhibit "Americans and the Holocaust" (July 7-August 18). This powerful exhibit examines the motives, pressures, and fears that shaped Americans' responses to Nazism, war, and genocide in Europe during the 1930s and 1940s. On Spiritual Gifts: 1 Corinthians 12: 4-7 tells us 4Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit. 5 And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord. 6 There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons. 7 But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. These manifestations are often referred to as "spiritual gifts." As we continue together in working in the "ministry of the Laity," we each must open ourselves to discernment of "our calling" in that work. Needless to say, discernment requires intentionality on our parts to spend time in prayer, Bible study and conversation with other Christians. Another help might be to complete what is known as a "Spiritual Gifts Assessment." You can complete one on-line by going to our website (trenholmroad.org), clicking on the "serve" tab and then choosing "spiritual gifts assessment." This will take you to the UMC Discipleship website. The survey will take about 15 minutes, and you will get your confidential results immediately. Adult Sunday school will be held 9:45 AM - 10:45 AM.


Youth and Children's Sunday School resumes August 20 from 9:45 AM - 10:45 AM.
