

PASTOR'S ARTICLE

The Connection



Once I heard my call into ministry, my next question (after "God, are you sure?") was, "which denomination?" I was raised in the United Methodist Church, but I spent time exploring the doctrine and polity of numerous protestant denominations. I discovered that I loved our Wesleyan heritage, that I agreed with our theology, and that our Church has a gift and a strength that some lack – our connection.

Because of our connection, churches do not fear being without a pastor. There are processes and standards in place for ordination. Our bishop, currently Bishop Holston, and the district superintendents make sure that pastoral leadership is provided through the process of appointments. In times of pastoral change, other churches can search for months (or longer) for new leadership. United Methodist pastors move on the same day.

Because of our connection, our churches are able to do more than we could ever do on our own. We can respond to disasters in Puerto Rico (Hurricane Ian), Florida (Hurricane Nicole), Alabama, Louisiana, and Mississippi (tornadoes) while simultaneously reaching distant shores to provide assistance and relief. Each congregation does what we are able to support this mission of the UMC based on the money we spend in ministry at the local church. The name for our missional giving through the United Methodist Church is apportionments.

Because of our connection, apportionments are not a tax or a bill. Apportionments are more like a tithe of the local church to the greater mission of Jesus Christ throughout the world. Yes, when we give to mission, money does leave the local church – just like Jesus called us to go into all the world baptizing and teaching. We are able to reach beyond our walls.

Because of our connection in missional giving, we send missionaries throughout the world, fight poverty, engage in ministry with the poor, build new churches, and prepare clergy and lay leaders for ministry. Because of our connection, we support those in Methodist residence homes, disciple college students through campus ministry, educate people through our SC Methodist colleges, challenge and transform youth at summer camp, and train and equip people throughout the state for ministry. I could go on and on because our connection extends throughout the world touching millions of lives.

Because of our connection, we are reminded that the church exists for the sake of those who are not members. We are challenged to care for the least, the last, and the lost. We are called to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world. We are invited to a life of discipleship.

I thank God for our connection, and the opportunities for ministry it provides for us to be faithful throughout the world.








TRUMC HIKING GROUP


TRUMC Church and Society Core Team


